PNEUMATOLOGY & ANTHROPOLOGY CHRISTIAN THEOLOGY 3

Theological anthropology concerns human beings and their relationship with God. It addresses humans as created in the image of God, with a special qualitative relation to God compared to other species. Sin is the corruption of the relation, indicating that humans are constitutionally opposed to God. Theological anthropology also deals with the restoration of the human relationship with God through the application of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Pollumatology concerns the person and work of the Holy Spirit, who indwells, empowers and gifts believers.



Dr. Chong Siaw Fueg is trained in the fields of education (University of Malaya) and human resource decement (PhD, Universiti Malaysia Sarawak) and also in theological studies specialising in the Old Testament (Princeton Theological Seminary, New Jersey, USA). He is the Principal of Seminari Theologi Malaysia.



BOOK OF ROMANS NT EXEGESIS

This course explores life, ministry, and theology of Paul as it comes to expression in his letters to the Romans. By means of expositional analysis, particular attention is given to Paul's Gospel, his theology of God, the cross, the law-free Gospel, the Holy Spirit, and ethics. Students develop skills in exegesis and capacity to critique theological systems commonly used to interpret Romans.




Dr Sam Tsang (PhD University of Sheffield, UK) has penned more than 50 books and countless articles.

Rather than solving or answering vocation-specific problems, this course aims to initiate students into serious processes of thought as guided by the following three objectives:


A. Contextual: to develop sensitivity for key issues that concern life in contemporary Singapore by identifying and analysing case studies taken from the local context.

INTRODUCTION TO NEW TESTAMENT

This course covers the historical, political, religious, and cultural background of the Inter-Testament period; authorship, dating, critical issues, and content and theological themes of the books in the New Testament; and the life, ministry, and mission of Jesus and the Apostle Paul. Particular emphasis is placed on engagement with texts in their historical contexts are the development of basic exegetical skills.

LIFE OF KINGS SPIRITUALITY OF KING DAVID

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This course covers the 'Golden Age' of Israel's monarchy with a special focus on the issues and challenges faced by king David as charismatic king, soldier, songwriter, shepherd, sinner, a man described by the LORD as one 'whose heart beats to my heart... who will do what I tell him'. As David is studied, it is obvious that he was a leader whose faith in Godwas unshaken even in the midst of difficult times. David was human and had faults and there are many spiritual lessons which we can learn from his life. David erred and failed, but his repentance and humility allowed him to subject himself to God's judgment and restoration.

To provide student with spiritual insights into personal spirituality, discernment when making difficult decisions in the pastoral ministry, hence applying biblical principles to issues confronting current Christian ministry. The student shall be better equipped to live before God in vulnerability, dependability and integrity. The student will journey through some of the more difficult circumstances of David's life and will gain learning experiences vicariously. At the end of it to avoid the mistakes made by David and one who bounced back as the man after God's heart.

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SPIRITUAL FRIENDSHIP

This course will seek to do a few things: First, we need to understand what actually is spiritual friendship. Next, we need to understand why it is so crucial that we follow Jesus in the context of Christian friendship. Then we will look at various ways we can actually experience spiritual friendship. We will also see that friendship is a key way we reach out to those outside God's community.

INTRODUCTION TO **OLD TESTAMENT**

This Course is an introduction to the 39 books of the Old Testament in order for the students to understand and appreciate their historical contexts, authors, theological themes and significances and the role of divine inspiration and authority.



- 2. To examine the major themes in the Old Testament.
- 3. To be aware of issues of debate in Old Testament study and the basic issues of Old Testament interpretation.
- 4. To appreciate the relationship between the Old and the New Testament.
- 5. To reflect on the usefulness of the Old Testament in daily living and in ministry.
- 6. To recognize various literary genres of the Old Testament. This includes an awareness of the vast differences between ancient cultural forms and the modern world.

MALAYSIA CHURCH HISTORY



This course seeks to explore the origin and development of the Christian Churches in Malaysia examining selected denominational histories of the various denominations (e.g. the Anglicans and Methodists among others) within the social, political and cultural context of Malaysia. The responses of the local churches towards autonomy from their mission societies, their witness and outreach will also be examined against the broader canvas of the historical processes within and without the country that impinge on the life and work of the Malaysian Church.


Selected examples of how the mission bodies and their local churches responded to the socio- economic and political realities of the country will also be discussed. In addition, there will be a thematic study on Christian mission and the state in Sarawak and a biographical study of a Christian personality.
